WORLD PLASTIC SURGERY DAY July15th - Sanubandhen Jevitah (Through Continuity [It] Lives)



"Plastic Surgery saves lives, Still people think it is frivolous."

Every time one attends a social function or for that matter an extended family get together, the moment they know I happen to be a Plastic Surgeon - end up getting the dreaded question, so what can you do about my face? How I wished to tell them, may be I can do something about the foot in a diabetic or may be for an injured hand, restoring the beauty of its function.

It is probably an answer to this that the Association of Plastic Surgeons of India (APSI) decided to have the concept of Plastic Surgery Day to create awareness of this specialty which practically touches all parts of the human body from the hair on the scalp to the toes. So under the leadership of Dr Raja Sabhapathy, The APSI President in 2011, the association decided to observe July 15th as National Plastic Surgery Day. After a period of 10 years, from 2021 onwards this came to be observed as World Plastic Surgery Day as decided by the American Society of Plastic Surgeons (ASPS) at the Global summit of 34 national Plastic surgery societies. It is indeed an honour for the APSI in the Land of Sushrutha whose understanding of the concept of pedicled flaps, "Sanubandhen Jevitah," (Sanskrit for- Through continuity it lives) laid the basis for modern day reconstructive plastic surgery.
